


Fig. 1 Package outline






Fig.6 Transient thermal impedance - junction to case

Fig.6 Gate characteristics







Fig.7 Surge (non-repetitive) on-state current vs time (with 50% V_{RRM} at T_{case} = 125°C)

Types available include cube clamps for single side cooling of 'T' 23mm and 'E' 30mm discs, and bar clamps right up to 83kN for our 'Z' 100mm thyristors and diodes.

Clamps are available for single or double side cooling, with high insulation versions for high voltage assemblies.
